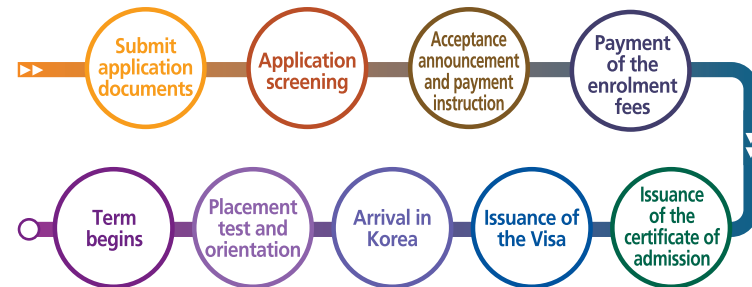

Stage 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Practice basic speaking and listening• Learn the most basic Korean language required for daily life
Stage 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Learn the basic sentence structures• Develop abilities to adapt to Korean culture and lifestyles
Stage 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Read and understanding basic writings, and write a short text• Improve Korean language skills to have no difficulty in daily life
Stage 4	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Learn to read short essays, newspaper articles, etc.• Develop skills to express opinions on politics, economy, society, and culture
Stage 5	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Learn to have discussions on various topics• Communicate in Korean without any difficulties in daily life
Stage 6	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Understand professional content without any difficulties• Use unique expressions and terminologies of the Korean language
